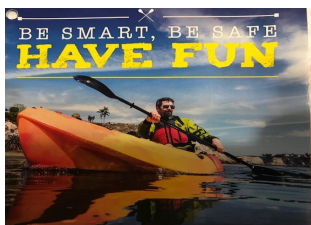

This one-day entry-level class is designed to familiarize students with the rules on the water. Experienced boaters will also benefit from the class since it includes the latest information on Georgia law as well as rules on coastal waters.

Class includes lessons:

1. Know your boat:

Parts of a boat and terminology every boater needs to know.

2. Before you get underway:

Know before you go, float plans, fueling, trailering, launching and retrieving.

3. Navigating the waterways:

Navigation rules, night navigation & lights, navigation aids, anchoring, locks and dams.

4. Operating your vessel safely:

Loading, trimming, handling, steering, docking, casting off, anchoring, PWC operation, environmental impact, courtesy

4. Legal Requirements:

Ages to operate, registration, safety, items and equipment required by law that must be on board and in working order.

5. Boating Emergencies:

Risk management, radio operation, boating accidents and reporting, injuries and weather emergencies, getting help and helping others.

6. Enjoying Water Sports:

Location of safety equipment, water etiquette, towing skiers and towables, hunting safety and much more.
